very strongly, averaging close to \$20,000 and five bulls sold to Studs. 56/56 bulls sold and averaged \$13,009.

It is all about the girls in the 'Engine Room' who can get in calf every year, raise a good weaner and do their job out on the hill country whist remaining structurally sound and lasting the distance. We have been super pleased with our 2018 born Heifer scanning results in March, our heavy spring AI programme work is coming to fruition and once again a very good 2020 pregnancy testing result. EBVs are definitely in the mix when we are considering a new or retained sire or for replacement heifer selection but at the same time, we have not compromised in any way on all the traits that we continue to value very highly at Kaharau - well balanced, easy doing, strong boned cattle with quiet temperament and correct structural soundness. All the cattle are frequently assessed and subjected to rigorous culling for temperament, structure and fertility.
